MISSION OF AWARDS PROGRAM

The A. Hays Town Awards seek to promote and award excellence in the design and execution of classical and vernacular architecture in Louisiana. In honor of architect A. Hays Town's legacy of rigorous study and perpetuation of Louisiana's architectural heritage, these awards will be granted to designers and craftsman who demonstrate exceptional literacy in the language of classical architecture and the building traditions of Louisiana.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligible projects must have been designed or crafted by individual ICAA members or member firms in good standing and based in Louisiana. ICAA members outside of Louisiana are eligible to apply on the condition that their submitted project be located within the state. All projects must have been completed between January 1, 2013 and the time of submittal.

WINNERS

The ICAA Louisiana Chapter asks that the jury award projects exemplifying excellence in the classical and vernacular building traditions of Louisiana. Entrants are asked to assign their projects to one of the design, building arts, or student / young professional categories defined below. The design categories are reserved for professionals currently working in the fields of architecture, interior design or landscape design. The building arts category is reserved for entrants physically fabricating or installing elements of a project. The student category is reserved for entrants currently attending design school in Louisiana. The young professional category is reserved for entrants who either graduated from a Louisiana design school within the past five years, or who have graduated from an out-of-state design school within the past five years and are submitting a project based in Louisiana. The jury is granted the latitude to assign any project to a category different from the one it was submitted under. The jury is also granted authority to not award any projects in a given category if the submitted projects do not exemplify excellence in the classical and vernacular building traditions of Louisiana.

The awarded project in a given category must represent the highest caliber of classical and traditional design and craftsmanship in Louisiana.

Rules and Eligibility

- 1. All individual members and member firms, in good standing, of the Institute of Classical Architecture & Art are eligible. Visit https://www.classicist-la.org/join/ for more information and to become a member.
- ICAA members with offices located within the State of Louisiana can submit projects located anywhere in the world.
- 3. ICAA members with offices located outside of the State of Louisiana can submit projects located only in Louisiana.
- 4. Projects submitted, except for Unbuilt Projects, Student Projects and Young Professional Projects, must have been completed within the last ten (10) years, and be substantially complete by the time of submission.
- 5. The individual or firm making the submission must have the approval of all those with legal ownership of the project and/or its design, including client, architect/designer of record, and developer.
- 6. The individual or firm making the submission must have permission to use all photography and/or printed material contained within the submission. The ICAA, and the ICAA Louisiana Chapter reserves the right to use all materials submitted in future print and digital media for promotional purposes.
- 7. Projects that have been previously awarded by other ICAA Chapters are not eligible.
- 8. Entrants who are found to be non-members or members not in good standing at the time of the submission deadline will be disqualified.
- 9. Student and Emerging Classicist category rules and eligibility:
 - a. Open to students/recent graduates and current students in the fields of art, design, craftsmanship, or preservation. There is no age limit.
 - b. Student and Emerging Classicist projects must be completed in a studio or as independent work, and must be completed during school or within five (5) years of graduation. The project is not required to have been built.
 - c. Applicants must be current members of ICAA at the time of submission. Visit https://www.classicist-la.org/join/ for more information and to become a member.
 - d. Student applicants must either be enrolled in or recently graduated from a school located in Louisiana, have a home address that is still in Louisiana, or be a recent graduate employed by a firm located within the State of Louisiana.
 - e. Emerging Classicist applicants must either be employed at a firm located within Louisiana, or must submit a project located within Louisiana.

CATEGORIES

ARCHITECTURE

Small Residential New Construction

Includes Single Family Houses under 3000 sf in size.

Large Residential New Construction

Includes Single Family Houses over 3000 sf in size.

Small Residential Addition / Renovation

Includes all single family renovation, addition, and restoration work under 3000 sf in size.

Large Residential Addition / Renovation

Includes all single family renovation, addition, and restoration work over 3000 sf in size.

New Civic/Commercial/Institutional/Multifamily/Ecclesiastical

Includes all Civic, Commercial, Institutional, Multifamily and Ecclesiastical Projects of any size.

Renovated Civic/Commercial/Institutional/Multifamily/Ecclesiastical

Includes all renovated Civic, Commercial, Institutional, Multifamily and Ecclesiastical Projects of any size.

On the Boards or Unexecuted Projects

Includes all unbuilt projects planned within the past ten years.

Projects currently under construction are **NOT** eligible.

INTERIOR DESIGN

Residential under 3000 sf

Includes all interior design within a single family residential context under 3000 sf in size.

Residential over 3000 sf

Includes all interior design within a single family residential context over 3000 sf in size.

Single Room

Includes all interior design within a single room in a residential context.

Civic / Commercial / Institutional / Multifamily / Ecclesiastical

Includes all interior design within a Civic, Commercial, Institutional, Multifamily and Ecclesiastical context of any size.

On the Boards or Unexecuted Projects

Includes all unbuilt projects planned within the past ten years.

Projects currently under construction are **NOT** eligible.

CATEGORIES

LANDSCAPE | GARDEN DESIGN

Small Residential / Estate

Includes orchestration of plant material and constructed elements in an exterior setting that supports a single family home.

Limited to 1 acre in size

Large Residential / Estate

Includes orchestration of plant material and constructed elements in an exterior setting that supports a single family home.

Exceeds 1 acre in size

Civic / Commercial / Parks / Planning / Multifamily / Ecclesiastical

Includes orchestration of plant material and constructed elements in an exterior setting. It is not required to be in proximity to or support an architectural building.

On the Boards or Unexecuted Projects

Includes all unbuilt projects planned within the past ten years.

Projects currently under construction are **NOT** eligible.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION

Residential

Includes all single family renovation, addition or restoration work of any size with historical consideration.

Civic / Commercial / Institutional / Multifamily / Ecclesiastical

Includes all renovation, addition or restoration work within Civic, Commercial, Institutional, Multifamily and Ecclesiastical projects of any size with historical consideration.

BUILDING ARTS

Built work crafted by the entrant and completed either as a freestanding element or as a permanent component of a building or landscape.

DESIGN STUDENT

Unbuilt design crafted by the entrant either as part of a course or as independent work. Reserved for students studying design in a College or University located within Louisiana.

EMERGING CLASSICIST

Built or unbuilt design crafted by the entrant as independent work.

Reserved for entrants who have either graduated from a Louisiana-based design school within the past 5 years or have graduated from an out-of-state school within the past 5 years and are submitting a project located in Louisiana.

Submission Requirements

- 1. Entries must be submitted to https://ahaystownawards.untapcompete.com/ and uploaded in PDF format. Submissions must NOT exceed 10 mb.
- 2. There shall be no names or identifying marks on any material submitted. Submissions that are not anonymous will be disqualified.
- 3. The submissions shall include the following:
 - a. Numbered images (maximum of 20) with the project title and captions of the front of each. The image count is defined as the actual number of photographs present. For example, if two photographs are included on a page they are counted as two images. Drawings, plans, elevations, etc. are not included in the image count.
 - b. Include applicable drawings with north arrow, graphic scale, and title on each.
 - c. Include a Project Summary, a single sheet containing a maximum of 500 words of text describing the project. Do not identify the firm or individual submitting, but do include the project title.
 - d. Each page of the entry must be included, bear no identifying marks, be clearly and sequentially numbered, with the project title included on every page.
